#### ♦ ENGLEWOOD WOMAN DIES IN CYCLE CRASH

An Englewood woman has been killed in a crash involving her motorcycle and an SUV. Kim Ann Loveday, 44, and her husband were riding their motorcycles on Lauderdale Memorial Highway near Charleston Sunday when an SUV made a left turn between the two motorcycles. Mrs. Loveday's cycle hit the SUV. She died at SkyRidge Medical Center. The driver of the SUV, John Wilkins of Charleston, is a member of the Bradley County Sheriff's office Volunteer Reserves, but was not on duty when the crash occurred.

## NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

◆ BP says its plans to inject heavy fluids and then cement into the leaking oil well in the Gulf of Mexico, later this week. It has a 60 to 70% chance of success. BP is facing growing pressure from the U.S. government to solve what President Obama calls an unprecedented environmental disaster.

• Homebuyers rushed to take advantage of government incentives and low mortgage rates in April, giving the housing market its biggest boost in five months. On Wall Street, the Dow Jones Industrials Average closed at 10,066.57; down 126.82 points.

• Shane Bauer and Sarah Shourd, two of the three Americans held in Iran on suspicion of spying, have gotten engaged in prison and will marry once they are freed.

• Heavily armed police patrolled Kingston, Jamaica, Monday after at least three people were killed in an outbreak of violence by supporters of an alleged drug lord who faces extradition to the U.S.

• How many miles do you have on your vehicle? No matter how high, it's low-mileage compared to the space shuttle Atlantis, which is closing in on the 120 million-mile mark as its final voyage nears an end. The shuttle is scheduled for a Wednesday landing.

## HOW NOT TO ROB A BANK

If you're thinking about robbing a bank, here are some true experiences of several would-be bank robbers that you might learn from:

**1. PICK THE RIGHT BANK.** You don't want to make the same mistake as the fellow in Anaheim, California, who tried to hold up a bank that was no longer in business and had no money.

**2. STUDY YOUR HISTORY.** Don't try to stick up the First National Bank of Northfield, Minnesota. Jesse James tried it 111 years ago and the townsfolk took just seven minutes to kill two and capture three of his gang. Nobody tried it again until 1984, and the customers chased the guy down.

**3. SPEAK TO THE RIGHT TELLER:** A robber in Upland, California, presented his note to the teller. The teller's father, who was in the next line, got all bent out of shape about it. He wrestled the guy to the ground and sat on him until police arrived.

**4. DON'T SIGN YOUR DEMAND NOTE.** Demand notes have been written on the back of a subpoena issued in the name of a bank robber in Pittsburgh...on an envelope bearing the name and address of the robber in Detroit...and on the back of a withdrawal slip giving the robber's signature and account number in East Hartford, Connecticut.

**5. TAKE RIGHT TURNS ONLY.** Avoid the sad fate of the bank robbers in Florida who took a wrong turn into the Homestead Air Force Base, drove up to a military police guardhouse, and thinking it was a toll-booth, offered the security men money.
