• UPDATE ON BICYCLE CRASH VICTIM

Here's an update on the condition of the bicycle rider who was struck by a car as the driver was swatting a bee that flew in his window. It happened last Thursday on East Madison Ave. in Athens. Heather Rose Umphrey, 21, was airlifted to Erlanger Trauma Center, where she has been undergoing treatment for a compression of the spine, a fractured wrist, whiplash, scrapes, and bruises. She is listed in stable condition.

♦ DRINK UP! THE WATER'S SAFE!

The drinking water delivered by Athens Utilities board in 2009 surpassed the regulations set by the state of Tenenssee and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The water undergoes tests for such things as turbity, flouride, nitrate, sodium, coliform bacteria, lead, and copper. AUB did not incur any violations for contaminent levels, monitoring, or reporting requirements in 2009.

♦ McMINN AIRPORT GETS \$78,850 GRANT

Governor Bredesen has announced that an aeronautics grant of \$78,850 has been approved for the McMinn County Airport. The grant will be used for an Airport Layout Plan, aerial photogrammetry, and pavement evaluation.

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

• North Korea warns it will sever all communication and relations with Seoul as punishment for blaming the North for the sinking of a South Korean warship two months ago.

◆ The Dow Jones Industrials Average plunged below 10,000 Tuesday after traders dumped stocks on worries about the global economy and tensions between North and South Korea. The Dow Jones Industrials Average closed at 10,043.75; down 22.82 points.

• Thousands of heavily armed police and soldiers fought with masked gangsters loyal to drug lord Christopher Coke in the slums of west Kingston, Jamaica, again Tuesday as they search for Coke. At least 30 people have died. The U.S. wants to extradite Coke.

• Live underwater video showed the underwater oil spill in the Gulf getting significantly darker, indicating the leak may have hit a reservoir of more oil and less gas. Meantime, BP is getting ready to pump heavy mud and cement into the well in an attempt to plug it. If that fails, they may try to inject assorted junk into the well to clog it and then will place a new blowout preventer on top of the one that failed.

• Guinness World Records says a Minnesota man, Igor Vovkovinskiy, is the tallest man in the U.S. at 7 feet, 8.33 inches.

1868 - President Andrew Johnson of Tennessee was acguitted of charges of "high crimes and misdemeanors". The House had impeached Johnson, but the Senate acquitted him by just one vote.

1907 - Actor John Wayne was born at Winterset, Iowa. He was best-known for his western movies and was nicknamed "The Duke".

1920 - Singer Peggy Lee was born in North Dakota. Her real name was Norma Dolores Egstrom. Her big break in show-biz came when Benny Goodman hired her to sing with his orchestra. She later had such hit records as "Fever", "Mr. Wonderful", and "Mañana".
