

◆ Al-Qaida has confirmed that its No. 3 official, Mustafa al-Yazid, has been killed along with his wife, three daughters, and a grandchild — perhaps one of the most severe blows to the terror movement since the U.S. campaign against al-Qaida began. A U.S. official says al-Yazid is believed to have died in a U.S. missile strike sometime in the past two weeks.

◆ Former Vice President Al Gore and his wife, Tipper, are separating after 40 years of marriage. According to an e-mail circulated among the couple's associates on Tuesday, the Gores said it was "a mutual decision made together following a process of long and careful consideration." The Gores reportedly were telling friends they "grew apart" after 40 years of marriage and there was no affair involved.

• The 40-year-old son of former ABC News anchor Ted Koppel, Andrew Koppel, was found dead in an apartment in upper Manhattan. Police did not give the cause of death, but did say he had spent hours drinking heavily with a man he met at a bar.

• Now that its "top kill" approach failed, BP is trying another temporary fix to stop the leaking oil well in the Gulf and siphon the oil to the surface by sawing through the leaking pipe and putting a cap on it. BP's stock prices fell steeply on Tuesday.
