1692 - Port Royal, Jamaica, was virtually destroyed by a major earthquake. Nearly 2,000 people died and 9/10th of the city sank beneath the sea. At the time, Port Royal had the reputation of being the wickedest city on earth. Some of the ruins can still be seen under the shallow waters off Kingston.

1864 - Delegates meeting in Baltimore nominated Abraham Lincoln and Andrew Johnson to head the Republican presidential ticket.

1936 - Singer Bonnie Brown was born. She and her sister and brother made up the popular group known as the Browns. Their biggest hit was "Three Bells."

1940 - Singer Tom Jones was born. His hit records include "She's A Lady" and "I t's Not Unusual."

1948 - The Western allies of World War II agreed to create the new state of West Germany. For years, a wall separated West Germany and Communist East Germany. It was taken down during the Ronald Reagan presidency.
