

- ♦ Dutchman Joran van der Sloot, long the prime suspect in the 2005 disappearance of Alabama teen Natalee Holloway in Aruba, has confessed to killing a young Peruvian woman in his Lima hotel room. A police spokesman says Van der Sloot admitted under questioning that he killed 21-year-old Stephany Flores on May 30 in a rage after learning she had looked up information about the Aruba case on his laptop without his permission while he was out buying coffee. Now that Van der Sloot has admitted to killing Ms. Flores, the father of Natalee Holloway says he should tell all he knows about her disappearance in 2005.
- ♦ Richard Butler of Knoxville had an ulterior motive when he asked his girfriend, Bethany Lott, to go hiking with him near Asheville, North Carolina. Butler had a ring in his pocket and was just minutes away from asking Bethany to marry him when they were hit by lightning. Bethany Lott, 25, of Knoxville took a direct hit and died at the scene. Butler suffered 3rd degree burns.
- ♦ General Motors Co. is recalling about 1.5 million vehicles worldwide to fix a problem with a heated windshield wiper fluid system that could lead to a fire. The recall affects several pickup trucks, sport utility vehicles, crossovers, and passenger car models from the 2006 to 2009 model years.
- China vows to keep a tight grip on the Internet, saying it will continue to block anything considered subversive or threatening to "national unity".
- ◆ The DJIA closed up 123.49 points at 9,939.98 on Tuesday.
