• BP says it plans to boost its ability to capture the oil gushing from a ruptured well in the Gulf of Mexico by early next week. Meantime, the Obama administration announced that the oil giant has agreed to speed up payments to people whose livelihoods have been washed away by the oil spill.

◆ Federal regulators on Thursday put in place new rules aimed at preventing a repeat of last month's harrowing "flash crash" in the stock market. Stocks surged Thursday as investors appeared pleased with reports that jobless claims dropped in May and with news that Chinese exports rose in May. The Dow Jones Industrials Average closed above 10,000 at 10,172.53; up 273.28 points.

• A suicide bomb ripped through a wedding party for a family with ties to police in the Taliban's heartland in Afghanistan, killing at least 40 people and wounding dozens more.
