- ♦ British energy giant BP has agreed to President Obama's demand to put \$20 billion in a special fund to pay damage claims from the Gulf of Mexico oil spill. Meantime, BP says it has begun burning some of the oil siphoned from the well to prevent it from spreading.
- ♦ Stocks mostly fell Wednesday after home construction and applications for building permits slumped in May following the end of a homebuyer tax credit. The Dow Jones Industrials Average managed to close with a small gain of 4.69 points at 10,409.46.
- ♦ A British family is outraged after learning that their now-deceased-daughter received a double lung transplant from a long-time smoker. Their 28-year-old daughter died from pneumonia just a few months after the procedure. The family says they were not warned that the donor had been a smoker for 30 years.
- ♦ Microsoft Corporation co-founder Bill Gates and billionaire investor Warren Buffett are launching a campaign to get other American billionaires to give at least half of their wealth to charity.
- ♦ A flight attendant was pressed into service after the co-pilot of an American Airlines flight became ill as the plane was preparing to land in Chicago. The pilot asked if any off-duty airline pilots were on board. The flight attendant told the captain she had her private pilot's license and she filled in as first officer during the landing.
