- ◆ President Obama has relieved Gen. Stanley McChrystal of his command of the war in Afghanistan because of biting comments he made about the president in a Rolling Stones magazine article. Obama named Gen. David Petraeus to replace McChrystal.
- ♦ Interior Secretary Ken Salazar says he will reissue the offshore drilling moratorium in water deeper than 500 feet, after a federal judge blocked the initial drilling ban. However, he says the new moratorium will include details on when the ban will end.
- ♦ Sales of new homes collapsed in May, sinking 33 percent to the lowest level on record, as potential buyers stopped shopping for homes once they could no longer receive government tax credits.
- ♦ To sustain the fragile economic rebound, the Federal Reserve decided to leave interest rates at record lows and indicated it will keep them there for a while. On Wall Street, the Dow Jones Industrials Average closed at 10,298.44; up 4.92 points.
- ♦ A Colorado man on a solo mission to hunt down Osama bin Laden is headed back to the United States, ten days after authorities found him in the woods of northern Pakistan with a pistol, a sword and night-vision equipment.
- ♦ The Library of Congress has added 25 recordings to its music library, including Little Richard's 1955 hit "Tutti Frutti."

1948 - Russia blockaded the western zones of Berlin, obstructing all rail, water, and highway routes. This set the stage for the "Berlin Airlift" in which the Western allies flew in supplies to meet the needs of more than 2-million people in West Berlin. The blockade was lifted 11 months later.
