♦ ATHENS GUARD UNIT COMING HOME

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

- ♦ Hurricane Alex weakened to a tropical storm on Thursday as it moved further inland over northeastern Mexico, dumping heavy rains that flooded cities, but sparing U.S. oil facilities near its path
- ♦ Hurricane Alex slowed oil clean-up and containment efforts in the Gulf of Mexico, with any permanent fix to BP's ruptured deepsea oil well still several weeks away. Meantime, the oil spill became the largest ever in the Gulf of Mexico on Thursday based on the federal government's estimate of 140.6 million gallons. That eclipses the 140-million-gallon spill off Mexico in 1979.
- ♦ A spokeswoman for former Vice President Al Gore says Gore welcomes a Portland, Oregon, police decision to reopen an investigation into a massage therapist's allegations that he groped her at a hotel four years ago.
- ♦ A new study says Florida and Georgia are the states in which motorists are most likely to get a traffic ticket. Montana is the state where drivers are least likely to get a ticket. Tennessee is #21 on the list of states most likely to hand out a traffic ticket.
