♦ THP ISSUING FEW TEXTING CITATIONS

It's been just over a year since the law banning texting while driving went into effect in Tennessee. Very few of those \$50 tickets have been issued. So far in 2010, the Tennessee Highway Patrol has issued only 88 citations for texting while driving. State and local authorities say it's difficult to enforce the law because officers have to determine whether the driver is actually sending a text message or dialing a phone number.

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

- ♦ Undersea robots worked a mile beneath the Gulf of Mexico on Monday to lower a new tighter-fitting cap over BP's leaking oil well. BP hopes the new cap will finally stop the leak after nearly three months.
- ◆ Police in Albuquerque, New Mexico, say six people are dead, including the gunman, after a shooting at a solar and fiber optics manufacturing plant. Police say the shooting stemmed from a domestic dispute.
- ♦ A militia group linked to al-Qaida is claiming responsibility for the twin bombings in Uganda that killed 74 people watching the World Cup final. A former University of Delaware rugby player was among the victims; his brother was involved in a plane crash in N. Carolina.
- ♦ Wildlife officials in Naples, Florida, say a 10-foot alligator bit off an 18-year-old man's hand while he was swimming in a canal with friends. Officials managed to catch the gator and retrieve the hand from its stomach. Doctors hope they can re-attach his hand.
- ◆ Scientists report advances in detecting and predicting Alzheimer's disease. They also say there is more proof that getting enough exercise and Vitamin D may lower the risk for Alzheimer's.


