• BP hopes to keep using its giant "stopper" to block oil from reaching the Gulf of Mexico until they can plug the leaking well permanently. BP says the first of two relief wells being drilled is just five feet away from its destination.

• The Coast Guard says the "Whale," a giant oil skimmer brought in from Portugal, is too big to be used in the Gulf cleanup. The Coast Guard says the vessel is not able to maneuver around the smaller patches and ribbons of oil on the water.

• Twin suicide bombings killed 48 people in Iraq on Sunday, including dozens from an anti-al Qaida militia lined up to collect their paychecks near a military base south of Baghdad.

• Actress Zsa Zsa Gabor, 93, is hospitalized in Los Angeles after breaking her hip when she fell out of bed while reaching to answer the phone.

• Tennesseans enjoy the lowest cost of living among all states according to a survey by the business news network CNBC. However, when it comes to quality of life the Volunteer State was ranked next to last. The poll measures quality of life by crime, health care, and local attractions. Only Louisiana ranked lower in quality of life.


