The TBI and the State Bomb and Arson Division are investigating the death of Monroe County Election Chairman Jim Miller, whose body was found in the trunk of a burned vehicle near Sweetwater Saturday night. Miller was the president of Jim Miller Excavating Company. Miller was 60. He had worked Saturday morning at the Election Commission Office because of early voting. He left around 12:30 p.m. and called his wife to say he was on his way home. However, he never arrived at home. No officials cause of death has been released, but several sources say Miller had been shot.

SHOP TAX FREE AUG. 6-8

The 5th annual Sales Tax Holiday in Tennessee is scheduled for Friday, August 6, and continuing through Sunday, August 8. During those three days, you can save nearly 10% on tax-free clothing, school and art supplies, and computer purchases. No state or local sales tax will be charged on select clothing with a price of \$100 or less per item, school and art supplies with a price of \$100 or less per item, and computers with a price of \$1,500 or less. Eligible computer items are CPU's and other computer items if they are part of a bundled computer package. iPad's are eligible for tax exemption, but video games and consoles are not.

- ♦ BP's broken well in the Gulf of Mexico was leaking oil and gas again Monday for the first time since the company capped it last week, but the Obama administration's spill chief said it was no cause for alarm. The stopper was left in place for now.
