♦ DEPUTY A "SUSPECT" IN MILLER MURDER

Monroe County deputy Kenny Hope has been suspended from duty as the TBI investigates the shooting death of Monroe County Election Commission Chairman Jim Miller. Hope says the TBI has told him he is a suspect in the case. However, Hope says he had "no motive" to kill Miller. The TBI has set up a 24-hour hotline for people to call with tips about the case: 423-519-8477.

♦ 6TH PERSON PICKS UP COUNCIL PETITION

Six people have now picked up petitions to run for the four Athens City Council seats that will be on the November ballot. Kyle O'Dell is the latest person to get a petition. Two people have already turned their qualifying petitions back into the McMinn County Election Commission: Dick Pelley and Hal Buttram. The qualifying deadline is 12 noon August 19.

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

- ♦ President Obama has signed into law the most sweeping overhaul of financial regulations since the Great Depression. The legislation gives the government new powers to break up companies that threaten the economy, creates a new agency to protect consumers, and increases regulation of the financial markets.
- ♦ The government is investigating an incident in which a United Airlines Boeing 777 jetliner hit severe turbulence on a cross-country flight over Kansas, injuring 22 passengers. One woman was thrown out of her seat with so much force that she left a crack in the wall when she hit the side of the cabin.
- ♦ A weather system brewing in the Caribbean threatens to shut down undersea efforts to seal BP's ruptured well. The storm may reach the Gulf this weekend.
- ♦ The U.S. has announced new sanctions against North Korea aimed at preventing the communist country from selling arms and then from using the income to buy luxury goods.
- ♦ On Wall Street, the Dow Jones Industrials Average closed at 10,120.53; down 109.43 points.
- ♦ Oakland, California, has legalized large-scale marijuana cultivation for medical use.


