◆ SCHOOL BELLS TO RING SOON

Summer is rapidly drawing to a close and it's nearly time to return to the classroom for another year. Here's the Back-to-School schedule:

Athens City Schools: August 6- Registration and an abbreviated day of school for ALL students. August 10-First full day of classes.

McMinn County Schools: August 4-Registration for NEW students. August 10-First day of classes.

Etowah City School: Same as McMinn County Schools. August 4-Registration for NEW students. Aug. 10 - First day of classes.

Meigs County Schools: August 6 - Registration for all students. August 9 - First full day of school.

Fairview Christian Academy: August 9 - Orientation, 7 p.m. August 11 - First day of classes.

Christ's Legacy Academy: August 5 - Parent orientation at 6 p.m. Required for all parents. August 10 - First Day of Classes.

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

◆ President Obama says the Iraq War is nearing an end "as promised and on schedule." Obama says he will meet his deadline of withdrawing all U.S. combat troops from Iraq by the end of this month. A transitional force of 50,000 troops will remain to train Iraqi security forces, provide security for ongoing U.S. civilian efforts, and conduct counterterrorism operations.

◆ The stock market began August with a huge rally after economic and earnings reports from around the world apparently revived investors' faith in the global recovery. The Dow Jones Industrials Average closed up 208.44 points at 10,674.38.

◆ The University of Georgia has won a national title this year--it's the top party school. The Princeton Review says Georgia has taken the top spot for the first time. Georgia beat out Pennsylvania State University, West Virginia University, and the University of Florida. By the way, the University of Tennessee is not in the top 10.

◆ Mitch Miller, the goateed orchestra leader who asked Americans to "Sing Along With Mitch" has died at age 99 in a New York hospital after a short illness. His orchestra had such hits as "The Yellow Rose of Texas" and "March From The River Kwai."

TODAY IN HISTORY - AUGUST 3

1492 - Columbus set sail from Spain on his first voyage across the Atlantic with three ships--the Santa Maria, the Pinta, and the Niña.

1811 - Inventor Elisha Graves Otis was born. He invented the modern elevator. He demonstrated his invention at the New York Fair in 1854 and cut the lifting rope to prove that the elevator's safety-device would keep it from falling.

1924 - Gordon Stoker, a member of the Jordanaires singing group, was born. The Jordanaires sang backup harmonies for many of Elvis Presley's early RCA recordings.

1926 - Singer Tony Bennett was born. His hit records include "I Left My Heart In San Francisco" and "In The Middle Of An Island."
