LOCAL & AREA NEWS

◆ PEARL WOWS UNITED WAY

Tennessee Basketball Coach Bruce Pearl was in Athens yesterday and helped kick-off the United Way's campaign with an inspiring speech. Pearl said that if everybody gave just a little, everyone will benefit. Campaign chair Frank Snyder said the goal is \$657,000 of which \$312,000 has already been raised; a 4% increase over last year.



◆ BANK ROBBERY SUSPECTS CAUGHT

Two women suspected of robbing the FSG Bank in Sweetwater a week ago have been arrested in Atlanta. LaTasha Madden and Maybeth Redwine were taken into custody by Atlanta police and FBI agents. Madden is accused of walking into the FSG Bank and demanding money, then fleeing in a car driven by Redwine.

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

◆ Hurricane Earl was packing winds near 125 mph as it approached the Outer Banks of North Carolina Thursday night. Hurricane warnings or watches now stretch from North Carolina north to near the Canadian border. Forecasters say the storm's strong winds could topple trees and knock out power to thousands of people along the U.S. East Coast.

◆ An offshore petroleum platform exploded and burned in the Gulf of Mexico 80 miles off the Louisiana coast Thursday. All 13 people aboard the rig have been accounted for. Officials say the platform was producing oil and gas and some leaked into the water.

◆ The economy got a lift Thursday with new data suggesting companies are not considering mass layoffs and retail stores are a little busier. The Dow Jones industrial average closed up 50.63 points.

◆ U.S. mortgage rates have fallen to new record lows, with the 30-year fixed-rate mortgage rates averaging 4.32%.

◆ A new study suggests that at least one in seven home kitchens would flunk the kind of health inspection restaurants have to undergo.

1783 - The seven-year American Revolutionary War ended with the signing of the Treaty of Paris which recognized U.S. independence from Great Britain.

1925 - Country singer Hank Thompson was born. His hit records included "Humpty-Dumpty Heart," "The Wild Side Of Life," and "Squaws Along The Yukon."

1939 - Great Britain declared war on Germany. France followed six hours later, and was quickly joined by Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, and Canada. World War II was now underway.

1942 - Al Jardine, a member of the Beachboys, was born.

1979 - Hurricane David, one of the strongest Atlantic storms of the past century, hit the eastern U.S. coast after sweeping through the Caribbean. Hurricane David killed more than 1,000 people and caused billions of dollars in damage.
