◆ As if voters don't have enough to be angry about this election year, the government is expected to announce this week that Social Security recipients will have to go through another year without an increase in their monthly benefits. It will be only the second year without an increase since automatic cost of living adjustments were adopted in 1975. The first year was this year.

◆ Chile's mining minister says a video inspection of an escape shaft leading to 33 trapped coal miners shows the hole's walls are firm enough to allow the men to be hoisted out as early as Wednesday.

◆ Singer Solomon Burke died on a plane shortly after arriving at Amsterdam's Schiphol Airport on a flight from Los Angeles Sunday. He was 70. His hit records include "Just Out Of Reach," "Everybody Needs Somebody To Love," and "Cry To Me."

THIS DAY IN HISTORY-Oct. 11

1868 - Thomas Edison filed papers for his first invention on this date. It was an electrical vote recorder to rapidly tabulate floor votes in the U.S. Congress. Members of Congress voted against it.

1884 - Eleanor Roosevelt was born. She was the wife of President Franklin D. Roosevelt and was perhaps America's most active First Lady. She served as a delegate to the United Nations General Assembly and also worked to help underprivileged people and minority groups.

1932 - Singer Dottie West was born in McMinnville, TN. She made commercials for Coca-Cola, including the award-winning "Country Sunshine." Other hit records included "Country Girl" and "Here Comes My Baby." Dottie West died in 1991 from injuries received in a car crash on the way to perform on the Grand Ole Opry.

1984 - Space shuttle Challenger astronaut Kathy Sullivan became the first American woman to walk in space.
