◆ 2011'S FIRST BABY ARRIVES

The first baby of the New Year in Athens was born Saturday, January

◆ MORE PROTECTION FOR McMINN DEPUTIES

McMinn County Sheriff's deputies are receiving an extra layer of protection heading into the new year, thanks to donations from the community. Sheriff Joe Guy says there is enough money to purchase bullet proof vests for all deputies. In the past, deputies who wanted to wear vests had to buy their own at a cost of \$600. Now that the county is providing the vests, it will be mandatory to wear them.

National & International News

- ♦ The new Congress convenes on Wednesday and the Republicans will have a 241-194 majority in the House. Republicans promise to cut spending, roll back President Obama's health care overhaul, and ease government regulations that tell people what they must or cannot do. However, getting the Senate to go along will be a challenge since Democrats still hold a majority there.
- ♦ Wildlife officials are trying to determine what caused more than 1,000 blackbirds to die and fall from the sky over Beebe, Arkansas, New Year's Eve. An ornithologist with the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission said the birds showed physical trauma and speculated that the flock could have been hit by lightning or high-altitude hail.
- ♦ Fighter jets were scrambled and the Capitol building in Washington was evacuated on Saturday after a passenger plane lost radio contact with air traffic controllers as it approached Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport. It turns out the pilot of the Piedmont Airlines flight had turned to the wrong radio frequency as he approached Washington. After about 15 minutes, the plane re-established radio contact and landed without further incident.
- ♦ Country singer Shania Twain and businessman Frederic Thiebaud tied the knot Saturday in a New Year's Day wedding in Puerto Rico. Twain's first marriage ended in divorce when her husband had an affair with Thiebaud's wife. Twain reached out to Thiebaud in the aftermath and they announced their engagement last month.

1918 - Maxine Andrews, one of the Andrews Sisters, was born. She died in 1995. The Andrews Sisters had scores of hit records in the 1940's and 50's.

1938 - The March of Dimes campaign to fight polio started. It was founded by President Franklin Roosevelt as the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis. It financed the research that produced the Salk and Sabin polio vaccines.
