♦ NELSON NAMED EDWARD JONES PRINCIPAL

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

- ◆ Capt. Owen Honors, the high-ranking Navy officer who produced and showed raunchy videos to the crew of the USS Enterprise aircraft carrier, has been relieved of his command.
- ♦ The governor of Punjab, Pakistan's wealthiest and most populated province, was shot and killed Tuesday by one of his bodyguards who was angry because the governor was against imposing the death penalty for people convicted of insulting Islam.
- ♦ Mystery shrouds the shooting death of former Pentagon official John P. Wheeler III. Wheeler disappeared after apparently boarding a train from Washington to his home in Delaware just after Christmas. His body was discovered in a landfill three days later. Wheeler was an adviser to four different administrations and was one of the main forces behind the Vietnam Memorial. His death has been ruled a homicide.
- ♦ On Wall Street, the second trading day of the new year saw the Dow Jones Industrial Average close at 11,691.18; up 20.43 points.
- ◆ Consumer Reports magazine has dropped its "recommended" rating from the Ford Edge and Lincoln MKX SUV's in part because of a complex audio and interior controls system which could be a distraction while driving.
- ♦ An Illinois couple has new twins, but they were born in different years. Ashley Fansler gave birth to a daughter at 11:59 p.m. on New Year's Eve. The baby girl's twin brother was born a minute later, on Jan. 1, 2011.
