#### ◆ IS MORE SNOW ON THE WAY ??

Get ready for more snow! The National Weather Service has issued a Winter Weather Advisory for Southeast Tennessee, including the Athens area, through 7 a.m. Saturday. Snow showers are expected through Friday with a few showers or flurries lingering into Saturday. Total snow accumulations should reach 2 to 5 inches by Saturday morning, with heavier amounts in the higher elevations.

#### **♦ ETOWAH 911 SYSTEM IS CHANGING**

Within a few days, when residents of Etowah call 911, their call will be answered by the McMinn County 911 dispatch center. Two of the Etowah Police Department's phone lines will be transferred to E-911. Etowah City Manager Matthew Gravley says this will be a very positive change for the citizens of Etowah. When they call 911, their call will no longer have to be transfered before police, firemen, or ambulance personnel can be dispatched. He says that a call to 911 will result in direct communication with emergency agencies. Gravley says the City of Etowah expects to see a substantial savings by letting the McMinn County 911 Center handle its emergency calls.

Citizens are also encouraged to bring their cardboard from Christmas packaging to the Recycle Center today from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. or Saturday from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.

## NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

- ♦ The first order of business in the new Republican-led House yesterday was to read aloud the Constitution of the United States. Lawmakers, both Republicans and Democrats, took turns reciting each verse and article of the document. Congressional historians say it's the first time the nation's governing document was read in its entirety on the House floor.
- ◆ Treasury Secretary Timothy Geithner says the U.S. may hit the legal limit on its ability to borrow by March 31st and faces serious consequences unless congress acts by then to raise the debt limit.
- ♦ Government officials say a federal investigation is underway to determine if sanitation workers were deliberately slow in removing snow from last week's massive blizzard in New York City.
- ♦ The Last Will & Testament that Elizabeth Edwards signed days before her death last month, made no mention of her estranged husband, John. In the will, Mrs. Edwards left her property to be divided among her children.
- ◆ Police say a Colorado lawmaker who advocates stricter seat-belt laws did not have her three-year-old grandson restrained during a fatal crash in Texas, and then moved the uninjured toddler into a car seat before police arrived.
- ♦ A crew member on a United Airlines flight from Chicago to Frankfurt, Germany, this week spilled his coffee on the plane's radio equipment, when the plane ran into turbulence, inadvertently transmitting an alert that the plane was being hijacked.


