#### **♦ TWO HOME INVASIONS IN OUR AREA**

On County Road 130, a woman, who was at home alone, was robbed Saturday around 1 p.m. A white female knocked on the woman's door and asked to use her phone because her vehicle had "broken down". When the homeowner turned to get her phone, a white male wearing gloves and a mask forced his way into the house along with the female--who held a gun to the homeowners head. The couple demanded money and the homeowner said she had some cash in her pocketbook. The male emptied the contents of her purse and kept the cash. The pair fled the scene in a dark to medium blue SUV--believed to be a Chevy HHR--with loud mufflers. The male was wearing a plaid shirt and was about 6 feet tall. Meanwhile, another home invasion occured around 3:30 a.m. Sunday in Meigs County, this time with 3 males forcing their way into the home; committing an act of rape. It's believed the same vehicle was used in the Meigs County case too.
