State & Local News ONLY ONE NEW HOUSE BUILT IN 2010

The Athens Community Development Office reports only one permit was issued last year for construction of a new home. A total of 392 permits were issued in Athens last year for construction projects of all types, including electric and plumbing work, remodeling, swimming pools, signs, etc. The total value of those construction projects was \$5,539,179. That's the lowest amount of construction in Athens since 1990. The highest amount of construction was nearly \$28 million in 1998. Construction projects in 2009 totaled just over \$7 million.

• More than 120 members of organized crime families in New England states have been arrested in one of the largest Mafia crackdowns in FBI history. The defendants face multiple charges of murder, extortion, and narcotics trafficking.

• Doctors say Congresswoman Gabrielle Giffords is beginning to stand up and is scrolling through an iPad as she makes what they call "fanstastic" advances. The 40-year-old congresswoman will be moved today from the Tucson hospital to a rehabilitation center in Houston, Texas, where her husband, Mark Kelly, lives and works as an astronaut. Kelly says he is extremely hopeful that his wife is going to make a full recovery. He predicts she'll walk back into the hospital in Tucson in two months and thank everyone who took care of her.

• U.S. claims for initial jobless benefits last week posted their biggest decline in nearly a year. Analysts say it shows a trend toward a healthier labor market. On Wall Street, the Dow Jones Industrial Average closed at 11,822.80; down 2.49 points.

• An elementary school bus filled with children collided with a snow plow in upstate New York Thursday, injuring several of the children.

• The number of people who bought previously owned homes last year fell to the lowest level in 13 years, and economists say it will be years before the housing market fully recovers.

• Police in Miami say burglars snorted the cremated remains of a man and two dogs by mistake, thinking it was cocaine.

1824 - Confederate General "Stonewall" Jackson was born. He got his nickname at the first Battle of Bull Run. Jackson's brigade faced overwhelming odds, but it formed a strong line and held its ground. One of his fellow generals exclaimed: "There is Jackson standing like a stone wall."

1940 - Golfing great Jack Nicklaus was born.

1941 - Opera singer Placibo Domingo was born. He and John Denver teamed up for a hit record titled "Perhaps Love."

1942 - Singer/songwriter Mac Davis was born. His hit records include "Stop and Smell the Roses" and "Baby Don't Get Hooked On Me." He wrote such songs as "In the Ghetto," "Watching Scotty Grow," "I Believe in Music," and "Memories."

1976 - Concorde super-sonic jet service between New York and London began via British Airways.
