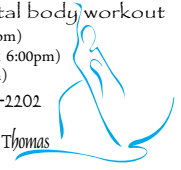

STATE AND LOCAL NEWS

◆ RISING FROM THE ASHES

Construction got underway Monday on the popular Country Patch Restaurant on South White Street in Athens. The restaurant was destroyed by a fire last August. The restaurant will be rebuilt within the original exterior walls which remained after the fire. Owners Debbie & Jimmy Gunn say they hope to re-open around the first of April. The new building will be made of steel.



◆ SMALLER GARBAGE TOTES AVAILABLE

Responding to the need of older citizens who say the 96-gallon garbage totes now being used in Athens are too heavy to maneuver, the Public Works Department advises that smaller, 48-gallon totes are available for those who prefer one. Call April Johnston at 744-2749 and your large tote will be replaced with a small tote on your next garbage collection day.

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

◆ The death toll stands at 35 from an explosion which ripped through Moscow's busiest airport on Monday. A suicide bomber detonated the explosion in the airport's international arrivals terminal. Approximately 170 people were wounded. President Dmitry Medvedev called it a terror attack and immediately ordered authorities to beef up security at Moscow's two other commercial airports and other key transport facilities.

◆ An Illinois Appeals Court has ruled that Rahm Emanuel's name cannot appear on the ballot for Chicago mayor. The court said the former White House Chief of Staff did not meet a residency requirement because he lived in Washington and not Chicago when he worked for President Obama. Emanuel says he will appeal.

◆ Technology stocks led broad gains in the stock market Monday after Intel Corp. increased its dividend and said it would buy back more of its stock. The Dow Jones Industrial Average climbed 108.68 points, closing at 11,980.52.

◆ Jack LaLanne, a one-time sugar-holic who became a fitness guru who preached exercise and healthy diets to a generation of American housewives, has died at the age of 96.

◆ A car collector who wanted a "piece of history" paid \$120,000 at an auction in Arizona for a 1963 ambulance that carried the body of President John F. Kennedy after he was assassinated.

◆ A member of the German parliament who was disciplined for refusing to wear a neck-tie has defended himself by saying most of his constituents don't wear ties either.
