#### ♦ ATHENS MAN KILLED IN WORK ACCIDENT

A construction foreman from Athens, 33-year-old John Womac, was killed in an accident at the Henley Bridge construction project in Knoxville. Authorities say Womac suffered massive head trauma when he was either hit by the arm of a track hoe or by a utility bucket Tuesday morning. He was pronounced dead at UT Hospital.

#### **♦ ETOWAH POLICE CHIEF SEARCH UPDATE**

The search continues for a new Etowah Police Chief. City Manager Matthew Gravley says he has gotten several resumes from four counties and has several interviews set up for the end of this week. Graveley says he hopes to wrap up the interviews next week and make a decision on a new chief shortly thereafter.

# NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

- ♦ President Obama called for a five-year freeze in non-security, discretionary spending during his State of the Union address Tuesday night. Obama also called for lawmakers to back a five-year plan put forth by Defense Secretary Robert Gates to save \$78 billion in defense spending.
- ♦ Russian Prime Minister Vladimir Putin vows that "retribution is inevitable" for the suicide bombing that killed 35 people at Moscow's busiest airport. Russian President Dmitry Medvedev is demanding robust checks at all transport hubs and he lashed out at the airport for lax security. No one has claimed responsibility for the bombing, but authorities suspect Islamist separatist insurgents from Chechnya.
- ♦ The unemployment rate rose in 20 states last month, fell in 15, and was unchanged in 15 including Tennessee. That's nearly the same as in November, when the rate rose in 21 states and fell in 15. The report indicates the job market is barely improving even though the economy is growing. The stock market reacted with the Dow Jones Industrial Average closing down 3.33 points at 11,977.19.
- ♦ "The King's Speech" has received 12 Academy Award nominations, more than any other movie. "True Grit" ran second with 10 nominations. Other films receiving nominations include "Toy Store 3," "The Social Network," and "127 Hours."
- ♦ An Argentine woman survived after jumping from the 23rd floor of a downtown Buenos Aires hotel. She landed on a taxi moments after the driver dashed to safety.
