◆ SHOOTING LEAVES FRIENDS STUNNED

Friends and co-workers are shaking their heads in disbelief after a murder-suicide at Fay Innovative Waste Solutions in Athens Wednesday afternoon. A longtime employee, Darrell Hester, got into an argument with the manager, Darrell Franklin. Franklin told him to go home and calm down. Hester left, but returned a short time later with a gun and shot Franklin and then killed himself. Franklin also served as pastor at Trinity Baptist Church in Madisonville. He would have celebrated his 14th year as pastor this Sunday. He and his wife had been making plans to go to Israel. He was supposed to have led the Wednesday night service at the church. Instead, church members held a prayer service to mourn his death.

- ✓ The McMinn County Historical Society will hold its monthly meeting this Sunday at 2 p.m. in the Blue Room of the McMinn County Courthouse. U.S. Air Force Col. Donald Edmands, Jr., (Ret.), past president of the Hiwassee Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution will have a program on the Revolutionary War.
- ✓ The Tennessee Highway Patrol will conduct sobriety checkpoints in McMinn County today.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

- ◆ Investigators say the suspect in the shooting deaths of two U.S. airmen at the Frankfurt, Germany, airport has confessed to targeting American military members. They suspect it was an act of Islamic terrorism.
- ◆ President Obama has praised Mexican President Felipe Calderon for his "extraordinary courage" in fighting drug cartels and cracking down on violence at the U.S.-Mexico border.
- ◆ In Wisconsin, Republicans have passed a resolution that would compel Democratic senators to return to the Capitol. It authorizes the missing senators to be taken into custody if they are found in the state. Republicans have also agreed to levy a \$100-a-day fine on the senators who fled Wisconsin more than two weeks ago to prevent a vote on a bill to strip government workers' unions of most bargaining rights.
- ◆ Chrysler has recalled 248,000 Dodge Journeys, Grand Caravans, and Chrysler Town and Country minivans made between August 3, 2009 and June 17, 2010, because of a defect that could allow the key to slip while driving and shut down the engine without warning. Meantime, Mazda is recalling thousands of 2009/2010 vehicles over concerns that a build-up of spider webs in the emissions system could lead to fuel tank cracks and possible leaks.
- ◆ A suspicious pile of white powder discovered on a desk at an ABC Network office in New York City on Thursday turned out to be instant soup.
- ◆ Stocks rallied Thursday as oil prices slipped. The Dow Jones Industrial average closed at 12,258.20; up 191.40 points.

- 1681 - William Penn received a grant from King Charles II of England to develop territory on the North American continent. The area later came to be known as Pennsylvania.
- 1789 - The U.S. Congress met for the first time in New York City; the new U.S. Constitution went into effect.
- 1801 - Thomas Jefferson became the first President to be inaugurated in Washington, D.C.
- 1888 - Knute Rockne was born. He became famous as the football coach at Notre Dame, where his teams won 105 games, lost 12, and tied 5. He died in a plane crash.
- 1958 - The nuclear-powered submarine "Nautilus" became the first submarine to reach the North Pole by "sailing" beneath the Arctic ice cap.
- 1997 - Comedian Minnie Pearl died in Nashville at age 83.
