STATE AND LOCAL NEWS

◆ ANOTHER RAFTING DEATH ON THE OCOEE

For the second time this month, there's been a fatal rafting accident on the Ocoee River in Polk County. A 14-year-old boy drowned Sunday afternoon when he was thrown out of the raft he was riding on. His leg became trapped under a rock, holding him underneath the water for 10 minutes. The victim was part of a group of teens from Atlanta who were attending a summer camp. Seven teenagers were in the raft when they were ejected from it near the rapids named "Mickey", the largest rapid above the Olympic section of the river. The other six were able to get to shore. A raft guide used a boat paddle to dislodge the boy's leg from under the rock, but it was too late to save him. A man drowned earlier this month when he fell from a raft in the Olympic section of the river. That was the first fatal rafting accident on the Ocoee in years.

◆ ATHENS MAY CONTINUE 911 SERVICE

The McMinn County 911 Center may possibly not take over the 911 service and police dispatching for the City of Athens after all. Athens City Manager Mitch Moore says consolidation has the potential of costing the City of Athens more money. Moore says he will recommend against the merger.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ The U.S. Supreme Court has blocked a massive sex discrimination lawsuit against Wal-Mart on behalf of hundreds of thousands of female employees. Now, the women who brought the case will have to pursue their claims on their own.

◆ Stocks climbed on Monday after word that Greece had gotten an ultimatum from euro-zone ministers in the latest effort to deal with its debt crisis. The Dow Jones average closed at 12,080.38 up 76.02 points.

◆ Research published in the journal of Pediatrics shows a child dies in a portable pool every five days during warm weather months. The research shows 209 deaths of children under 12 from 2001 through 2009. Most of the children were under 5.

◆ The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports that food allergies affect about one in 13 U.S. children. Peanuts and milk were the most common sources of allergies.

◆ U.S. donations to charity rose to \$291 billion last year. But the Giving USA Foundation says that was still more than 6 percent below the record set in 2007, before the recession.

◆ The group that controls Internet domain names has voted to allow virtually unlimited new domain names. In addition to .com, .net, .gov, and .edu, applicants can petition for new Website suffixes using nearly any word in any language.
