### STATE AND LOCAL NEWS

#### ◆ McMINN COUNTY LOSES UNWANTED TITLE

For the past two years, McMinn County has had the unwanted distinction of being the "meth capitol" of Tennessee, if not the nation. However, Sheriff Joe Guy says we have now lost that title. Guy says meth lab seizures this year are down nearly 50%. The drop in meth labs follows the sheriff's request in February that retail stores stop selling all products containing pseudoephedrine for 100 days. Pseudoephedrine is the main component used in manufacturing meth. Sheriff Guy says "if there is no pseudoephedrine, there is no meth." Last year, 161 meth labs were seized in McMinn County.

#### ◆ HUGE STORM TAKES OUT POWER & TREES

A violent but short-lived storm system struck Southeast Tennessee just before dark yesterday, taking out thousands of trees and leaving much of the area in the dark. Chris Liner sent us this photo taken in the Clearwater area. AUB received about 1100 power outage phone calls last night.



### NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ Former Utah Gov. Jon Huntsman joined the Republican presidential contest on Tuesday. He pledged to run a civil campaign. He said he and President Obama both love the U.S. but have different visions of its future.

◆ A senior defense official says President Obama will withdraw 10,000 U.S. troops from Afghanistan this year, with one brigade of 5,000 leaving this summer.

◆ Stocks advanced broadly on Tuesday as optimism grew over an upcoming confidence vote by the Greek parliament. The vote is a key hurdle for the country to avoid a debt default. The Dow Jones industrial average closed at 12,190.01 up 209.63 points.

◆ Federal health officials have unveiled nine new warning labels that will be plastered on cigarette packages next year. The graphic images will include photographs of horribly damaged teeth and lungs and a man exhaling smoke through a tracheotomy opening in his neck.

◆ NBC has apologized for cutting the words "Under God" from the Pledge of Allegiance in its leadup to TV coverage of the U.S. Open last weekend.

### Obituaries

### ATHENS POLICE & FIRE REPORTS FOR MAY

Athens Police Chief Chuck Ziegler reports there were 7 armed robberies in the city during May. There were 62 thefts, 13 burglaries, two motor vehicle thefts, 17 assaults, and one sex offense. In addition, there were 22 drug cases.

Chief Ziegler's report also shows there were 71 vehicle accidents in the city in May and one pedestrian was struck by a vehicle. There were 18 injuries in those accidents, with no fatalities.

The Chief reports there is one Police Department vacancy.

Fire Chief Jim Dyer reports that firefighters responded to 42 calls in May. Two were to commercial businesses, 9 to vehicle accidents, one grass fire, one vehicle fire, and several false alarms. Other calls involved unauthorized burning, EMS assists, and a gasoline spill. The total losses in May were \$76,500.

### TBI RELEASES CRIME STATS

The TBI has released a study of crime statistics for the past ten years. The report shows credit card fraud has increased by 135% in the last ten years. Hate crimes increased by 50%. Drug and narcotics violations increased by 45%.

Some categories actually went down. DUI cases decreased by 13% in the last ten years and crimes against property dropped 9%.
