STATE AND LOCAL NEWS

◆ ACLU FILES "OCCUPY NASHVILLE" SUIT

The American Civil Liberties Union has filed a 31-page lawsuit seeking a temporary restraining order against a curfew on property around the state capitol in Nashville by Governor Haslam. The suit says the Governor violated state law when he issued a curfew on Legislative Plaza last week. The curfew led to the arrest of protesters last Friday and Saturday. State troopers did not make any arrests Sunday night, as about two dozen protesters stayed on the Plaza overnight.

◆ TENNESSEE GETS CAR CHARGING STATION

Cracker Barrel has unveiled the first electric vehicle fast-charging station in Tennessee. Senator Lamar Alexander was on hand Monday for a ceremony at the Cracker Barrel at I-40 in Lebanon. The restaurant chain plans to open 12 high speed chargers across the state during November.

◆ EARTHQUAKE RATTLES AREA

A small earthquake rattled McMinn County Monday afternoon. The quake measured only 1.9 and was centered 4 miles east of Niota. It was one of dozens of tiny tremors that occur each year along a fault line that crosses East Tennessee.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ Herman Cain confirms that he was accused of sexual harassment when he was head of the National Restaurant Association, but said the attacks were "baseless." Cain said "I have never sexually harassed anyone."

◆ Stocks fell more than 1 percent on Monday as enthusiasm over the agreement to tackle the euro zone debt crisis waned. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 276.10 at 11,955.01.

◆ Halloween activities were cancelled Monday night across many of the New England states due to the early-season storm which dumped as much as 30 inches of snow in some places. The number of people without electricity was 2 million by Monday evening, but falling. The death toll from the storms stands at 12.

◆ President Obama continues to govern by executive order. His latest order directs the Food and Drug Administration to take steps to reduce drug shortages that have placed patients at risk and led to higher prices.

◆ A new survey of burglars shows a whopping 74 percent use social media, such as Facebook, to find out when residents will be away from their homes--either at work or on vacation. Many burglars also use Google Street View to get an up-close look at the homes of intended victims.

1871 - War correspondent and author Stephen Crane was born in New Jersey. He wrote a masterpiece about the Civil War titled "The Red Badge of Courage."

1937 - Singer Bill Anderson was born in Georgia. He has written and recorded many hit records, including "Still," "Mama Sang A Song," and "I Get The Fever." He is still a regular performer on the Grand Ole Opry.

1939 - Rudolph the Red-nosed Reindeer was born. The story of Rudolph first appeared in a pamphlet given away by a Chicago store. The song, written by Johnny Marks, is based on the story. It was recorded by Gene Autry and became a tremendous Christmas-time hit.

1950 - Two Puerto Rican nationalists tried to assassinate President Harry Truman. They failed, but the attempt caused two deaths and several injuries.

1991 - Clarence Thomas took his seat as a justice on the U.S. Supreme Court.
