◆ DRUG TAKE BACK UPDATE

MADCAT (McMinn Anti-Drug Coalition Aiding Teens) held its Fall Drug Take Back event this past Saturday. People were invited to bring their outdated and unused prescription pills to the Athens Police Station, the Niota Police Headquarters, or the Bi-Lo parking lot in Etowah for proper disposal. Mike Womack, Executive Director of MADCAT, says he was disappointed that the goal of 100 pounds of pills was not reached. He did say that one lady came to the Athens drug take back site and turned in the strong pain pills her husband had been taking before his recent death. NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

- ◆ October may have been one of the best months ever for the stock market, but November is not getting off to a very good start. Markets plunged on Tuesday on fears that Europe's plan to save the euro was unraveling. The Dow Jones Industrial Average closed down 297.05 at 11,657.96.
- ◆ Bank of America has bowed to consumer pressure and has decided to drop plans to charge a \$5 monthly fee for debit card use. SunTrust and Regions also announced they are ending monthly charges and will reimburse customers.
- ◆ President Obama passed his latest physical check-up with flying colors. A two-page medical report says the president is in excellent health and is fit for duty. Obama, who has struggled to kick his smoking habit, was described as being "tobacco free," eating healthy, exercising regularly, and drinking alcohol in moderation on occasion.
- ◆ The sheriff in Spartanburg County, South Carolina, is urging women to get concealed weapons permits and carry .45-caliber weapons to protect themselves. Sheriff Chuck Wright recommends women carry .45-caliber handguns because he says they wouldn't have to be accurate, just close to the target.

The meeting will begin at 1 p.m. at the Comfort Inn on Decatur Pike. Officials will explain the construction schedule and challenges they could face in a question-and-answer session. Construction on the Unit Two reactor at Watts Bar is expected to be finished in 2013.
