State & Local News

◆ GOVERNOR PROPOSES TAX CUT ON FOOD

Governor Bill Haslam is proposing to lower Tennessee's sales tax on food and to raise the exemption on the state's inheritance tax. The governor is asking state lawmakers to reduce the state's 5.5 percent sales tax on food to 5.3 percent. His goal is to get the tax down to 5.0 percent in three years. Governor Haslam also wants to raise the exemption on inheritance taxes from \$1 million to \$1¼ million. The governor also says he endorses Mitt Romney for the Republican presidential nomination.

◆ THIEVES DO BIG DAMAGE AT FISHER FIELD

Athens Parks Director Austin Fesmire says copper thieves caused about \$7,000 in damages at Fisher Field. The electrical boxes for each light were destroyed and the cables leading to the scoreboard were cut. Police say the thieves also took some metal sewer covers. Fesmire says all the copper and metal taken by the thieves probably netted them less than \$100, but will cost the city \$7,000 to repair the damage.

◆ FORMER YOUTH LEADER INDICTED

A former church youth leader in Maryville has been indicted on child sex charges. Laura Salazar, 39, was indicted on seven counts of statutory rape by an authority figure. Her husband was indicted earlier, pleaded guilty, and is serving a 20-year sentence. They served as youth leaders at The Lord's Disciples Church in Maryville until their arrest. The indictment says the couple engaged in unlawful sex with three teenage girls.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ The Romney campaign reports it raised \$24 million during the fourth quarter of 2011. The campaign says it has \$19 million in cash on hand as it heads into the crucial South Carolina primary after victories in Iowa and New Hampshire.

◆ Joran van der Sloot, the prime suspect in the disappearance of Alabama teenager Natalee Holloway in Aruba, has pleaded guilty to the 2010 murder of 21-year-old Stephany Flores in Peru. He will be sentenced on Friday. Van der Sloot reportedly claimed in a confession shortly after the murder, that he had killed Flores because she found information linking him to Holloway on his computer.

◆ Twenty-six states challenging President Obama's healthcare overhaul have filed a U.S. Supreme Court brief in which they argue that Obamacare unconstitutionally expands the Medicaid program for the poor and disabled. The brief says that by threatening the states with a loss of federal funds, Congress unconstitutionally coerced states into expanding their Medicaid programs.

◆ Stock prices edged lower on Wednesday after hitting a five-month high on Tuesday. Investors continue to have the jitters over further weakness in the euro. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 13.02 at 12,449.45.

◆ Hostess Brands, Inc., the maker of Twinkies and Wonder Bread, is seeking bankruptcy protection. The company blames its pension and medical benefits, increased competition, and tough economic conditions as main causes for their financial problems.


