◆ AUB TO RAISE RATES SLIGHTLY

The per kilowatt hour rate for AUB power will rise by about a half-cent in June as a result of an increase in TVA's fuel charge. AUB spokesman Wayne Scarbrough says the typical residential customer will see about a \$7 dollar increase in their monthly power bill compared to May.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

- ◆ After making his historic remarks on same-sex marriage last week, President Barack Obama has held a conference call with black church pastors to explain his support for gay marriage.
- ◆ Evoking memories of Bill Clinton's testimony, prior to his impeachment, about the meaning of the word "is", lawyers defending John Edwards appear to be basing much of his defense on the legal interpretation of the word "the."
- ◆ A new video released by the President's re-election campaign, suggests that Mitt Romney is a job-killing economic "vampire". A spokesperson for the Romney campaign says the former governor welcomed Obama's "attempt to pivot back to jobs and a discussion of their failed record."
- ◆ Eduardo Saverin, the Facebook co-founder who gave up his U.S. citizenship, says he has nothing against the U.S., just its complicated rules on U.S. citizens holding money overseas. Mr. Saverin, who now lives in Singapore, decided last year to renounce his U.S. citizenship. The move sparked an outcry among some tax experts who suspect he's aiming to save on taxes.
- ◆ Aimee Copeland, the Georgia student who contracted a rare flesh-eating disease after a zip line injury, is awake and alert but still in critical condition. The 24-year-old has had her left leg amputated and may lose her other foot and both hands.

THIS DAY IN HISTORY - May 15

1859 - Pierre Curie, co-discoverer of radium, was born in France. He and his wife, Marie, shared the Nobel Prize for Physics for discovering radium.

1918 - The world's first regular air mail service was established between Washington, D.C., Philadelphia, and New York. The aircraft was a Curtiss "Jenny" biplane.

1918 - Country singer Eddy Arnold was born. He was known as the Tennessee Plowboy. His hit records included "Anytime," "Cattle Call," and "Make the World Go Away."

1930 - Ellen Church, the first airline stewardess, went on duty aboard a United Airlines flight from San Francisco and Cheyenne, Wyoming.

1948 - Hours after declaring its independence, the new state of Israel was attacked by Transjordan, Egypt, Syria, Iraq and Lebanon.

1972 - Alabama Governor George Wallace was shot and critically wounded at a presidential campaign rally in Laurel, Maryland.
