◆ WOMEN AT THE WELL SUCCESS STORIES

For years in McMinn County, a ministry called Women at the Well has been helping troubled women turn their lives around. WATW Director Robin Nation shares these success stories:

Cassie was looking at 10 years in jail. She was given the opportunity to come to WATW, where she is studying to get her GED. She recently passed the pre-test and attributes it to Bible readings, reports on assigned books, and scripture memorization. Before this, she had never read a book all the way through.

Kristy was sitting in a jail cell with no hope. After coming to WATW, she is now in the internship program and recently went on a mission trip to Iowa. Instead of sitting in jail, she is ministering in a prison in Iowa.

Cynthia lost everything, including her family, her pride, and her drivers license. After reading a testimony by Phoebe Masters, one of the WATW graduates, she decided to make a change in her life. She has been at WATW for over a year, has gotten her drivers license back, and is now spending a month working as an assistant at a women's residential home in North Carolina.

Danielle was angry, defeated and tangled in cult religion when she came to WATW. Today, she is experiencing a new freedom and joy in Jesus Christ and recently became the 41st WATW graduate.
