◆ SHOOTING & MURDER IN MEIGS COUNTY

The Meigs County Sheriff's Department is investigating a murder that occurred around 10 p.m. Saturday. According to the Sheriff's Department, an argument broke-out between Nathan Whitener, age 24, and Joshua Smith, age 25, at the Whitener residence on Burkett's Chapel Road. The argument escalated into a shooting, resulting in the death of Nathan Whitener. Joshua Smith has been charged with second degree murder and is being held on a \$100,000 bond. He is scheduled for arraignment today.

◆ Libyans tried to rescue Ambassador Chris Stevens, cheering "God is great" and rushing him to a hospital after they discovered him still clinging to life inside the U.S. Consulate, according to witnesses and a new video that emerged Monday from last week's attack in the city of Benghazi.

◆ Campaign aides say Mitt Romney plans to release a new batch of TV ads this week that will seek to explain more about what he would do as president. The new ads will highlight Romney's plan to create 12 million jobs, cut the deficit, and allow the nation to become energy independent.

◆ A report by the American Cancer Society says cancer has replaced heart disease as the leading cause of death among U.S. Hispanics.

◆ Family members and Amtrak officials are looking for a retired California man, 69-year-old Charlie Dowd, who disappeared from a train somewhere between Denver and Chicago. This Day In History - Sept. 18

1709 - English writer Samuel Johnson was born. He compiled the first English dictionary.

1793 - President George Washington laid the cornerstone of the U.S. Capitol.

1819 - French scientist Jean Foucault was born. He invented the gyroscope, which is used to keep airplanes and ships level.

1927 - The Columbia Phonograph Broadcasting System (later CBS) debuted with a network of 16 radio stations.

1928 - An estimated 4,000 people were killed by a hurricane that lashed Florida and the West Indies for five days.

2001 - Letters postmarked Trenton, N.J., that later tested positive for anthrax were sent to the New York Post and NBC anchorman Tom Brokaw.
