◆ BOLO ISSUED FOR ESCAPED PRISONER

The Monroe County Sheriff's Department has issued a "Be on the Lookout" for Ricky Gennoe who escaped from a prisoner work detail at Hiwassee College Tuesday afternoon. NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ Another 19 people have been diagnosed with fungal meningitis linked to possibly tainted vials of a steroid medication, bringing the total number of cases to 231.

◆ The U.S. Supreme Court has denied Ohio's request to curtail early voting in the state, a victory for the President's re-election campaign which fought Republican efforts to scale back in-person balloting in the days leading up to Election Day. Ohio, critical to the election hopes of both candidates, began early in-person voting earlier this month but planned to cut it off on November 2, the Friday before the election, except for members of the military. The Obama campaign, the DNC, and the Ohio Democratic Party sued Ohio officials to restore early voting right up to the eve of election day. Republicans opposed their efforts, saying a cutoff was needed to reduce voter fraud and ease the burden on election officials.

◆ The Cuban government announced Tuesday that it will eliminate a half-century-old restriction that requires citizens to get an exit visa to leave the country.

◆ Secretary of State Hillary Rodham Clinton is taking full responsibility for the security failure last month at the US Consulate in Benghazi, Libya, appearing to be trying to shield her boss, who's locked in a tight re-election battle, from further political fallout.

Sen. Alexander to Receive Honor

The government of Japan will honor Tennessee Senator Lamar Alexander today with the "Order of the Rising Sun, Gold and Silver Star," in recognition of his service and dedication to Japan-U.S. friendly relations. The decoration, conferred by the emperor of Japan, will be presented by Mr. Motohiko Kato, the new Consul-General of Japan in Nashville today, at a ceremony attended by state and local officials and executives representing Japanese companies operating in Tennessee.

THIS DAY IN HISTORY-OCTOBER 17

- 1915** - American playwright Arthur Miller was born. His works include the play, "Death of a Salesman."
- 1919** - The Radio Corporation of America (RCA) was created. The company later birthed the NBC radio network.
- 1931** - Mobster Al Capone was convicted of income tax evasion and sentenced to 11 years in prison.
- 1933** - Physicist Albert Einstein arrived in the United States as a refugee from Nazi Germany.
- 1978** - Jefferson Davis was restored his American citizen, 89 years after his death. He was the President of the Confederate States of America during the Civil War. He had been denied restoration of his citizenship after the northern states won the war.
- 1979** - Mother Teresa of Calcutta, India, was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. She was a Roman Catholic nun who dedicated her life to caring for the sick and poor.
- 1989** - An earthquake measuring 7.1 on the Richter scale struck northern California, killing 67 people and causing \$7 billion worth of damage.
