Local and State News

◆ SAILPLANE LANDS IN HIWASSEE RIVER

No one was injured Sunday afternoon when a sailplane made a forced landing in the Hiwassee River. The aircraft was from the Chilhowee Gliderport. The pilot, John Good of Mill Creek, Pennsylvania, says when he landed in the water, he turned the glider toward Taylor's Island and eased it up to the shoreline. Taylor's Island is located near Highway 30 and Quinn Springs. The glider was not damaged. Even the glider's computer came through unscathed.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ Margaret Thatcher, Britain's first woman prime minister, known as the "Iron Lady", died on Monday at the age of 87. Thatcher stood for deregulation, a smaller state, free markets and privatization. She helped to end communist rule in Russia.

◆ Annette Funicello died on Monday. She became a child star as a Mouseketeer on "The Mickey Mouse Club" in the 1950s. She later teamed up with Frankie Avalon in a string of '60s movies with titles like "Beach Blanket Bingo" and "Bikini Beach". She was 70.

◆ Macy's lawsuit against J.C. Penney Co. and Martha Stewart continued Monday in Manhattan after the companies failed to reach a settlement. Macy's accused J.C. Penney of selling Martha Stewart products online which is in violation of its exclusive deal with Macy's. Martha Stewart said she believes her company was permitted to sell products with her name in places besides Macy's.

◆ Defense Secretary Chuck Hagel is recommending that military commanders be stripped of their ability to reverse criminal convictions of service members. This is in response to a congressional uproar over Lt. Gen. Craig Franklin overturning the conviction against Lt. Col. James Wilkerson, who had been found guilty of charges of abusive sexual contact, aggravated sexual assault and three instances of conduct unbecoming of an officer and a gentleman. This change would require congressional action.

1865 - Confederate General Robert E. Lee surrendered to Union General Ulysses S. Grant at Appomattox Courthouse in Virginia, thus ending the Civil War.

1932 - Carl Perkins ("Mr. Blue Suede Shoes") was born. His biggest hit was "Blue Suede Shoes." He also wrote "Daddy Sang Bass," a big hit for Johnny Cash, as well as the Judds #1 hit "Let Me Tell You About Love." Perkins died in 1998 from throat cancer.

1945 - National Football League officials made it mandatory for football players to wear socks in all league games.

1977 - The Swedish group Abba debuted at number one on the American pop charts with "Dancing Queen".

2003 - Jubilant Iraqis celebrated the collapse of Saddam Hussein's regime, beheading a toppled statue of their longtime ruler in downtown Baghdad.
