NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

- ◆ Pro-Life activists are harnessing the outrage generated over the trial of 72-year-old Kermit Gosnell, a Philadelphia abortion doctor, to pressure lawmakers to pass more restrictive abortion laws. The activists believe that late-term abortions are inhumane and unsafe and should be banned. Gosnell is accused of murdering four babies by cutting their spinal cords after they were born alive. He's also accused of murdering a patient, who died of a drug overdose allegedly administered by Gosnell.
- ◆ The Florida Senate sent Governor Rick Scott a package of capital-punishment reforms designed to prevent condemned killers from spending decades on Death Row. The bill which passed 84-34 is expected to be signed into law by Governor Scott.
- ◆ Investigators have removed bags of evidence including some containing DNA samples from the home where the widow of suspected Boston Marathon bomber Tamerlan Tsarnaev has been living. Female DNA has apparently been found on one of the bombs.
- ◆ The New York Jets have waived Tim Tebow. Tebow was told he had been cut after he arrived at the team's facility in Florham Park, N.J. After leaving the facility, Tebow quoted on Twitter a few hours later, scripture from Proverbs 3:5-6.
