Local and State News

◆ "STINGER" NETS 12 ARRESTS

The McMinn County Sheriff's Office conducted an all day "Stinger" on Monday, netting 12 arrests for charges ranging from shoplifting to manufacturing meth to assault. Sheriff Joe Guy also says two drug operations were shut down. Officers spent the day conducting saturation patrols in areas where there have been an increase in burglaries, serving arrest warrants, and investigating citizen complaints about crimes in their neighborhood.

◆ ATHENS CITY COUNCIL UPDATE

The Athens City Council got an update from Police Chief Chuck Ziegler and Fire Chief Jim Dyer at its recent monthly meeting.

Chief Ziegler reported there were 83 thefts in the city in June, 22 burglaries, 15 assaults, 4 sex offenses, and two robberies. Citations were issued for 588 moving violations in June.

Fire Chief Dyer reported that firefighters responded to 35 calls in June. Two were to residences, five were vehicle accidents, one was a grass fire, and eight were false alarms. The total loss from fires for the month was \$22,500.

Community Development Director Anthony Casteel reported building permits were issued for three new houses during the second quarter for a total value of \$406,000. A total of 108 building permits were issued during the second quarter for various projects for a total value of \$22,890,580. That was sharply higher than the total for the second quarter of 2012, which was \$2,128,527.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ Massachusetts State Police Sgt. Sean Murphy, the veteran of-ficer who was relieved of his duty last week after he released photographs documenting the capture of Boston Marathon bombing suspect Dzhokhar Tsarnaev to Boston magazine, is receiving support from Facebook users. A Facebook group aims to save Murphy's job and has gathered more than 40,000 likes.

◆ George Zimmerman helped rescue four people from an overturned vehicle last week, just days after he was cleared of all charges in the shooting death of Trayvon Martin. Zimmerman spoke with a deputy at the scene and then left. He was not a witness to the crash.

◆ Michael Madison, 35, an Ohio man was charged Monday with three counts of aggravated murder and kidnapping after three bodies wrapped in trash bags were found in suburban East Cleveland, Ohio. Madison didn't enter a plea at a brief court appearance, and waived his right to a preliminary hearing.

◆ Dennis Farina, died Monday morning in a Scottsdale, Arizona hospital after suffering a blood clot in his lung. Farina, a onetime Chicago cop who was a popular character actor, played a TV cop on "Law & Order" during his wide-ranging career.

◆ The Duke and Duchess of Cambridge welcomed a baby boy yesterday afternoon at 4:24 p.m. London time. The baby weighed 8 lbs. 6 oz. A statement issued by both families said, "Her Royal Highness and her child are both doing well and will remain in hospital overnight." The newborn is third in line to the British throne after his grandfather, Prince Charles, and father, Prince William.

MONDAY'S MARKET REPORT: The U.S. stock market closed little changed after fluctuating between gains and losses, as housing data and corporate earnings fuel investor optimism that the monetary stimulus may continue. Previously owned home sales fell unexpectedly in June as tight supply and increasing rates for mortgages imperiled the real-estate market recovery in the U.S. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 1.81 at 15,545.55. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 3.44 at 1,695.53, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 12.77 at 3,600.39.
