### ◆ ARNOLD WINS BRONZE MEDAL

Sarah Kelly Arnold recently won the Bronze Medal at the FAI Women's World Gliding Championships in France. It was the first medal the U.S. has won in the sport of soaring since 1992. Sarah and her husband, Jason, operate the Chilhowee Glider Port on Highway 411 north of Benton.

## NATIONAL NEWS

◆ Newborn Paul Joseph Fronczak was stolen in 1964 from the Michael Reese hospital in Chicago by a woman posing as a nurse who was never caught. In 1965, an abandoned baby found outside a variety store in Newark, New Jersey was believed to be the stolen baby Paul. He was reunited with his Chicago family. Decades later a DNA tests reveal Paul is not the Fronczak's biological child. The FBI announced they are reopening the cold case of the kidnapped baby.

◆ One third of the \$448 million Powerball jackpot was claimed on Thursday by Paul White, 45, a project engineer from Ham Lake, Minnesota. White said he had been waiting for this day his entire life and that he'll take a lump sum, which will amount to \$58.3 million after taxes.

◆ As many as 600 homes were threatened while a growing wildfire chewed through a rugged Southern California mountain range on Thursday. Buildings were damaged and some 1,500 people were forced to leave the area.

◆ One of the original Munchkins, from the 1939 classic movie "The Wizard of Oz," Margaret Pellegrini, has died. She was 89. Pellegrini suffered a stroke at her Glendale home and died Wednesday at a Phoenix-area hospital.

## Thursday's Market Report

U.S. stocks rose, snapping a three-day decline as markets were encouraged by positive economic data from China. Export and import data in China rebounded sharply, both topping estimates and indicating a hopeful sign for the country's economy. The advance was broad-based for the day as all S&P sectors except Telecommunications finished in positive territory. U.S. Treasury prices finished higher following an above-average demand at today's 30-year bond auction. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 27.65 at 15,498.32. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 6.57 at 1,697.48, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 15.12 at 3,669.12. The spot price of gold rose \$25.37 to \$1,313.02. The spot price of silver rose \$0.70 to \$20.29, and crude oil prices fell \$0.54 to \$103.83 per barrel.

**1854** - Henry David Thoreau published "Walden," which described his experiences living near Walden Pond in Massachusetts.

**1945** - The United States exploded a nuclear device over Nagasaki, Japan, instantly killing an estimated 39,000 people. The bombing came three days after Hiroshima was bombed.

**1963** - Singer Whitney Houston was born. Her biggest hit records include "The Greatest Love Of All" and "I Will Always Love You."

**1969** - Actress Sharon Tate and four other people were found murdered in Los Angeles. Cult leader Charles Manson and a group of his followers were later convicted of the crime.

**1974** - President Richard Nixon's resignation became effective at noon, and Vice President Gerald Ford was sworn in as the nation's 38th President.
