State & Local News

◆ MORE WOMEN ARE PACKING HEAT

More women in Tennessee are going armed these days. The Tennessee Department of Public Safety says 32,354 handgun carry permits were issued to women last year. That's an increase of 55% in the past five years. The latest statistics show there are 431,258 gun carry permit holders in Tennessee.

◆ HERSHEL WALKER COMING TO ATHENS

The Athens Area Chamber of Commerce says football star Herschel Walker will be the speaker for the 8th Annual Dinner to be held in late June or early July of next year. At the University of Georgia, Walker set an NCAA freshman rushing record and helped lead the team to the national collegiate football title. He won the 1982 Heisman Trophy in his junior year.



National & International News

◆ Syrian government forces were almost certainly responsible for two massacres last May in which up to 450 civilians were killed. There were nine mass killings in all, attributing all but one to government forces. Apparently both government and rebel fighters have committed war crimes including murder, hostage-taking and shelling of civilians.

◆ In the heart of the eastern coastal city of Benghazi, a powerful car bomb exploded Wednesday near Libya's foreign Ministry building. It was exactly one year after the September 11th attack there that killed the U.S. ambassador and three other Americans.

◆ Two Democratic state lawmakers, Senate President John Morse and Senator Angela Giron have been kicked out of office in a recall election in Colorado promoted by both grassroots activists and the National Rifle Association.

◆ Victims of loved ones of the 9-11-2001 attack gathered at ground zero to commemorate the attacks' anniversary. Relatives recited the names of the nearly 3,000 people who died when hijacked jets crashed into the World Trade Center, the Pentagon and near Shanksville, Pa., as well as the 1993 World Trade Center bombing victims' names.

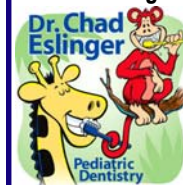

Wednesday's Market Report

U.S. stocks closed higher as diminishing concern over a U.S. military strike in Syria offset Apple's biggest decline since April. Apple closed down over 5% after the price of its new lower-cost iPhone failed to impress investors. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 135.54 at 15,326.60. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 5.14 at 1,689.13, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 4.01 at 3,725.01. In commodity markets, the spot price of gold rose \$0.38 to \$1,364.23. The spot price of silver rose \$0.17 to \$23.15, and crude oil prices rose \$0.36 to \$107.75.

1609 - British explorer Henry Hudson discovered what later became the Hudson River. He was attempting to find a route around North America to the far east.

1818 - Richard Gatling was born in North Carolina. He invented the "Gatling" gun, which consisted of 10 barrels clustered around a revolving shaft. It was turned with a crank and could fire 350 rounds per minute.

1931 - Country singer George Jones was born. His hits include "She Thinks I Still Care" and "He Stopped Loving Her Today." The "Possum" passed away April 26, 2013.
1944 - Singer Barry White was born in Galveston, Texas. One of his biggest hit records was "You're The First, The Last, My Everything." He died in 2005.

2008 - A commuter train engineer ran a red light while text messaging on his cell phone and struck a freight train head-on in Los Angeles, killing himself and 24 other people.
