NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ The United States and its diplomatic partners hope to seal an interim agreement restricting Iran's nuclear program. This will be the start of a six-month countdown to reach a final accord, or face the possibility of war. U.S. officials say that the breakthrough deal, offers Iran gradual, limited and reversible sanctions relief in return for halting suspicious nuclear activities.

◆ The U.S. Supreme Court put a halt to same-sex marriages in the state of Utah, just weeks after a lower judge's ruling sent people rushing to get married, even though the state constitution forbids it.

◆ Colleen LaRose, a Pennsylvania woman involved in a deadly terror plot has been sentenced to 10 years in prison. LaRose accepted a government request to reduce the sentence, because of her extensive cooperation with investigators. LaRose, called herself "Jihad Jane" online and agreed to kill a Swedish artist who had offended Muslims.

◆ Hillary Clinton, the former secretary of state and first lady insists she is months away from making a decision to run for president in 2016. However, other reports suggest that she will decide soon.

◆ Due to serious health issues that have recently arisen in her family, Liz Cheney, daughter of former Vice President Dick Cheney, will not be running for Senator in the state of Wyoming. Cheney did not elaborate on the health issues.
