Local & State News

◆ BODY OF NURSING STUDENT FOUND

The TBI has confirmed that a human skull found near a rural road in Decatur County this past Sunday belonged to nursing student Holly Bobo. Miss Bobo was last seen in April of 2011 when she left her home in Parsons. Two men found the skull near property owned by the family of Zach Adams, who has been charged with Miss Bobo's kidnapping and murder.

◆ WOMAN ROBBED ON WAY HOME FROM STORE

Athens police are investigating an armed robbery that happened on Cleveland Avenue Monday night. The victim told police that she and her children were walking home from Ingles Supermarket when a black male approached them from behind. She said he pointed a small handgun at her and demanded money. She gave him her wallet. The suspect then ran toward Old Riceville Road.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ The leader of one of Syria's most powerful Islamist insurgent groups Ahrar al-Sham was killed by an explosion on Tuesday, and at least 28 of its commanders are dead. Ahrar al-Sham is a hardline Islamist group and part of the Islamic Front alliance that has been in armed conflict with the Islamic State group which has seized swathes of territory in Syria and Iraq.

◆ Emergency workers battled to reach hundreds of thousands of people marooned by floods in India and Pakistan that have claimed more than 400 lives. The army airlifted boats to the worst-hit areas of Indian Kashmir, where whole villages were submerged and an estimated 400,000 people stranded in the region's worst flooding in half a century.

◆ A shark killed a man Tuesday at eastern Australia's popular Byron Bay despite a beachgoer's brave rescue attempt. The victim received medical treatment on the beach but did not survive.

◆ The Colossus roller coaster at Six Flags Magic Mountain located in Valencia, California, has fallen to the ground after a fire ravaged its wooden structure. The Los Angeles County Fire Department was called to the park on Monday afternoon, and quickly contained the blaze that broke out while crews were working on the ride. The 36-year-old roller coaster had been closed for 3-weeks for renovations.

◆ Disgraced NFL running back Ray Rice, speaking at a press conference, said that he was in "good spirits" and trying to be "strong for my wife" despite being cut by the Baltimore Ravens and suspended indefinitely from the National Football League over a video showing him punching his then-fiancée in a hotel elevator and knocking-her-out.
