◆ PLANS ANNOUNCED FOR LEAF PICK-UP

The Athens Public Works Department announces that loose leaf collection routes will begin on Monday, November 3rd, at 7 a.m. If you would like to have your leaves collected, simply rake them to within three to five feet from the edge of the road as soon as they fall to the ground. Do not place any leaves in the road, in ditches, or on sidewalks. Do not place leaves on or close to any obstacles. Leaves placed around mailboxes, trees, fences, poles, or yard decorations will be skipped by the leaf machine operators. The hose on the machines cannot reach back to vacuum around obstacles. Routes will not be published. However, you may call the Leaf Hotline at 744-2776 for a weekly update on locations where the vacuum trucks are working. Up to three trucks will be working in different parts of the city.

National & International News

- ◆ The U.S. and two Arab allies took aim Wednesday at a key source of financing for Islamic State militants, bombing 12 of the oil refineries controlled by the terrorist group in Syria. Black market oil contributes up to \$2 million a day to the militant group.
- ◆ President Obama led the UN Security Council in approving a resolution demanding that countries take action to stem the flow of foreign jihadists to Iraq and Syria.
- ◆ A Georgia man accused of leaving his toddler son to die inside a hot car will not face the death penalty. After reviewing the state's death penalty statute and other factors, Cobb County District Attorney Vic Reynolds said in an emailed statement that he won't seek the death penalty against Justin Ross Harris. He declined to elaborate.
