## Local & State News

### ◆ 7 TENNESSEANS ON RICHEST PEOPLE LIST

Forbes magazine has announced its list of the 400 richest Americans this year. Seven Tennesseans are on the list. They include Thomas Frist, Jr., whose family founded HCA in 1968...Frederick Smith, founder and CEO of FedEx...Forrest Preston, founder and chairman of Cleveland-based Life Care Centers of America...and Jimmy Haslam, CEO of the Pilot Flying J truck stop chain and majority owner of the Cleveland Browns NFL team. Their net worths range from \$1.8 billion for Haslam to \$7.6 billion for Frist.

### ◆ MORE TENNESSEE HEADLINES

✓ Governor Haslam is calling on all state agencies to plan for upwards of 7% spending cuts in the upcoming budget year. The move follows a spending year in which revenues fell more than \$300 million short of projections, leading the governor to cancel planned raises for state workers and teachers this year.

✓ Officials plan tighter security at a juvenile detention center in Nashville where teens staged three major escape attempts in September. Jim Henry, commissioner of the state Dept. of Children's Services, says he will seek court approval to be able to lock the teens in their rooms and give guards access to tear gas in emergencies.

✓ A first grade teacher at Vonore Elementary School has been removed from the classroom after she was arrested on a drug charge. Police stopped Emily Pennington, 29, for speeding in a school zone. They found hypodermic needles which she said she had just used to ingest oxymorphone pills.

## NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ Authorities with the Centers for Disease Control revealed that a Texas man just back from West Africa has been confirmed as having the first case of Ebola to be diagnosed in the U.S. The man is in "strict isolation" at Texas Health Presbyterian Hospital in Dallas.

◆ In mainly Shi'ite Muslim districts of Baghdad on Tuesday, at least 35 people were killed in a wave of car bomb and mortar attacks. It was one of the most violent days the capital has witnessed since U.S.-led forces began bombing Islamic State insurgents last month in Iraq.

**TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT:** U.S. stocks finished lower as economic data offset positive corporate news. Consumer confidence unexpectedly fell in September to a four-month low as Americans' views of the labor market deteriorated. Other data showed U.S. single-family home prices rose in July at the slowest pace in two years. Volume on the New York Stock Exchange was moderate, with 940.89 million shares traded. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 28.32 at 17,042.90. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 5.51 at 1,972.29, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 12.46 at 4,493.39.

**Commodity markets:**

The spot price of gold fell \$6.62 to \$1,209.20.  
The spot price of silver fell \$0.44 to \$17.06.  
And crude oil prices fell \$3.16 to \$91.41.

### TODAY IN HISTORY-OCTOBER 1

**1878** - General Lew Wallace was sworn in as governor of the New Mexico Territory. He went on to deal with the notorious outlaw, Billy the Kid, and to write the novel, *Ben Hur*.

**1880** - A new director of the United States Marine Corps Band was named. John Philip Sousa became the band's 17th leader. In 1888 he composed *Semper Fidelis*, traditionally known as the official march of the Marine Corps.

**1890** - Yosemite National Park was dedicated in California.

**1908** - The Ford Model T, which was introduced by Henry Ford, went on sale. More than 15 million Model T's were eventually sold, all of them black. The cost for the Model T was \$825.00.

**1924** - Jimmy Carter was born in Plains, Georgia. He went from a peanut farmer to a state senator to governor and in 1977 became the 39th president.

**1926** - Pianist Roger Williams was born. His biggest hit records were "Autumn Leaves" and "Near You."

**1962** - "From New York ... heeeeeeeeeere's Johnny!" Ed McMahon introduced the new host of NBC's *Tonight Show* for the first time. Johnny Carson entertained late-night America for nearly three decades.

**1971** - Walt Disney World opened in Orlando, Florida.

**1974** - Five Nixon aides, including John Ehrlichman and Nixon's Chief of Staff H.R. Haldeman went on trial for conspiring to hinder the Watergate investigation.

**1996** - Theodore Kaczynski was charged by a U.S. federal grand jury with mailing a bomb that killed advertising executive Thomas Mosser in 1994. Kaczynski, known as the Unabomber, pleaded guilty in January 1998 to mail bombings that killed three people and injured 23. He was sentenced in July 1997 to life without possibility of parole by a federal court in Sacramento, California.
