◆ LOCAL POWER RATES TO FALL IN NOVEMBER

Athens Utilities Board says local power rates are going to fall by just over 3% in November, making it the fourth consecutive month that rates have declined. AUB's Wayne Scarbrough says the decrease in November is a result of TVA having lower fuel expenses.

National & International News

- ◆ A second nurse, Amber Joy Vinson, 29, who cared for Ebola patient Thomas Eric Duncan has been diagnosed with the deadly disease one day after flying from Ohio to Texas. Vinson reported a fever late Tuesday and was immediately isolated at Texas Health Presbyterian Hospital in Dallas. Her condition has worsened, and she will be flown to a biocontainment unit at Emory University Hospital in Atlanta.
- ◆ The highest observation deck in the world opened Wednesday in Dubai, giving visitors an amazing view of the Middle Eastern city. The impressive sight will cost you \$109 if you book in advance. The new deck is on the 148th floor of the Burj Khalifa skyscraper and is 1,821 feet tall. The Empire State Building's top deck by comparison, is on the 102nd floor, about 1,200 feet above ground.
- ◆ On Wednesday, US stocks finished a turbulent day in the red, rallying somewhat from a huge midday drop spurred by worries over global economic weakness and the Ebola epidemic. The Dow Jones Industrial Average fell 173.45 points to 16,141.74.
- ◆ North and South Korea held high-level military talks on Wednesday to air grievances over recent exchanges of fire across their land and sea borders. Government officials and officers met for five hours at the border truce village of Panmunjom. This is the highest-level military exchange between the two rivals for seven years.

The historic Hiwassee River Rail Adventure scenic excursion continues through October. The 3½ hour "Loop Trip" takes riders through the Cherokee National Forest, along the Hiwassee River, through the secluded Hiwassee River Gorge, and around an engineering marvel known as The Great Hiwassee Loop. The train runs on Friday, Oct. 17, at 9:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. and on October 19, 20, 21, 22, 23 at 1:30 p.m. and on Oct. 24 with departures at 9:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. from the L&N Depot in Etowah. There are also day trips to Copperhill on Oct. 18 and 25 at 9:30 a.m.
