### ◆ DEATH CLAIMS LUTHER "MR. RADIO"

A broadcast legend has died. Luther Masingill died Monday morning after a brief illness. He was 92. Known to most folks in Chattanooga and across southeast Tennessee simply as "Luther," he first sat down behind the radio microphone on December 31, 1940.

He was on the air live during both the attack on Pearl Harbor in December 1941 and the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001.



Luther personally signed on WDEF Television in April of 1954. Over the decades, he informed and entertained several generations of listeners, and helped reunite lost pets with their owners. He was inducted into both the National Radio Hall of Fame and the Tennessee Radio Hall of Fame. Luther had been on the air for nearly 74 years, longer than any other broadcaster in the entire world.

◆ Darren Vann, a convicted sex offender suspected of murdering at least seven women and leaving the bodies in abandoned houses in northwest Indiana may be a serial killer who has killed others in the state as far back as 20 years ago. Vann, 43, of Gary, Indiana, was charged in Lake County with the murder of 19 year old Afrika Hardy. Once in custody Vann was cooperative and admitted his involvement in Hardy's murder and led police to the bodies of six other women, all in abandoned houses in Gary.

**1805** - In one of history's greatest naval battles, the British fleet under Admiral Horatio Nelson defeated the combined French-Spanish fleet at the western entrance of the Gibraltar Strait. Admiral Nelson was killed in the battle.

**1833** - Swedish chemist and industrialist Alfred Nobel was born in Stockholm. He invented dynamite. He also originated the annual prizes which still bear his name.

**1875** - Due to a paper shortage, the editor of a newspaper in Australia bought all the handkerchiefs he could find and printed his newspaper on the hankies.

**1879** - Thomas Edison invented a workable electric light at his laboratory in Menlo Park, N.J.

**1973** - An embargo by Arab oil-producing states on all petroleum exports bound for the United States became total when Kuwait, Bahrain, Qatar, and Dubai announced they had cut off all shipments of oil to the U.S.
