◆ EASTER EGG HUNT SCHEDULES

- The annual Etowah Easter Egg Hunt will be held this Saturday at 11 a.m. at the 7th Street Ball Field behind Etowah City School. Over 5,000 eggs will cover the lawn. The hunt is for children ages 2-10. Registration for the hunt will begin at 10 a.m.
- The VFV Post on N. Congress Parkway will have an Easter Egg Hunt open to the public this Saturday at 12 noon. There will be hot dogs and refreshments, and everyone is welcome.
- The Niotia Egg Hunt will be at 11 a.m. this Saturday at Kenneth Gable Memorial Park. The hunt is for ages up to 12.
- Registration to participate in the Community Easter Candy Drop at the McMinn County Airport this Saturday has ended. Three hundred children have registered, and that is the maximum allowed.

NATIONAL AND WORLD NEWS

- ◆ Iraqi Prime Minister Haider Al-Abadi announced Tuesday that Iraqi Security Forces had retaken the city of Tikrit from ISIS forces.
- ◆ The Arkansas State Legislature approved three amendments to an Arkansas bill similar to the controversial "religious freedom" bill signed into law in Indiana last week. The bill was passed weeks ago, and three amendments passed the state Senate on Tuesday. The combined bill will be sent to Gov. Asa Hutchinson's desk for his consideration.
- ◆ Lufthansa airlines issued a statement confirming that the co-pilot of the crashed Germanwings plane had informed them of his medical history during his training. In spite of that admission, he went on to receive the medical certificate confirming his fitness to fly and completed his training to earn a spot as a co-pilot for Germanwings, a subsidiary of Lufthansa.

 - ✓ The Tennessee Highway Patrol will be conducting sobriety checkpoints in McMinn County this Friday, April 3.
 - ✓ Tennessee Wesleyan College track runner Avery Hubbard won the 60 meter NAIA Indoor National Championship recently. Hubbard's win marks the first national championship win for TWC's track program, which is in its third year.



TODAY IN HISTORY – APRIL 1

Today is April Fool's Day. The observance originated in France after a new calendar was adopted in 1564. Until then, the New Year was celebrated on April 1st. When it was changed to January 1st, some people still celebrated it on April 1st. They came to be known as April Fools.

1789 - The U.S. House of Representatives held its first full meeting in New York City.

1873 - Russian composer Sergei Rachmaninoff was born. He composed the "Second Piano Concerto," which contained the melody for the song, "Full Moon and Empty Arms."

1932 - Actress and singer Debbie Reynolds was born. Her biggest hit record was "Tammy."

1933 - Nazi Germany began persecuting Jews with a boycott of Jewish-owned businesses.

1934 - Singer Jim Ed Brown was born. He and his two sisters performed as "The Browns," and had such hits as "The Three Bells" and "Scarlet Ribbons."

1945 - American troops swarmed ashore on the island of Okinawa to fight the Japanese during World War II.

1956 - Chet Huntley began his successful news career with NBC.

1960 - The first weather satellite, TIROS-1, was launched from Cape Canaveral.

1970 - President Richard Nixon signed a measure banning cigarette advertising on radio and TV.

1999 - A New Jersey man was arrested and charged with originating the "Melissa" e-mail virus, which infected more than 1 million computers worldwide.
