Local & State News

◆ NIOTA DEPOT CLOSED TEMPORARILY

The Niota Depot will be closed until further notice due to structural damage to the historic building. A part of the ceiling collapsed. While repair work is taking place, the Niota City Hall offices will be moved to another location to be announced later.

NATIONAL AND WORLD NEWS

◆ President Obama touted the nuclear deal struck by the world's top powers and Iran on Tuesday, insisting that it will prevent Iran from obtaining a nuclear weapon while also sending a clear warning to Congress that he would veto any effort to derail the accord.

◆ If the new nuclear treaty with Iran goes forward, the Iranian General accused of supplying militants with weapons to kill Americans during the Iraq war, will have his travel ban lifted and foreign assets unfrozen. Those sanctions were imposed by the UN.

◆ House Speaker John Boehner described the Iran nuclear deal as "unacceptable" and vowed to stop the deal from moving forward.

◆ Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell criticized the Iran nuclear deal, saying it is a result of a "flawed perspective" on the part of the Obama administration. McConnell said "Instead of making the world less dangerous, this 'deal' will only embolden Iran, the world's largest sponsor of terror, by helping stabilize and legitimize its regime as it spreads even more violence and instability in the region."

◆ VIOLENT STORMS CAUSE BIG DAMAGE

The largest and most powerful thunderstorms to impact Southeast Tennessee this year, moved through the area late yesterday and left a large amount of damage in their wake. The steeple was toppled from Sweetwater's First Assembly of God Church. About 7,500 customers lost power in Monroe County. A tree fell across a car in the City Park area of Athens. Flooding was widespread across the City of Athens. The National Weather Service said that EF-1 tornadoes touched down in Fentress, Pickett, and Putnam counties.
