NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ The FBI says the man who killed five military personnel in Chattanooga a week ago acted alone without help from anyone else. The FBI's special agent in charge, Ed Reinhold, says investigators are treating the Chattanooga shooter as a "homegrown violent extremist." Reinhold says it is too early to determine if he was "radicalized" before the attacks at the two military sites. Officials say he opened fire on a recruiting office, firing from his rented Mustang convertible. He then drove to a Marine-Navy facility about seven miles away on Amnicola Highway. He crashed through the gates and then entered the facility, firing at people he encountered. He shot one person inside the building, then went out back and killed four service members in the motor pool area. The shooter died after a gunfight with Chattanooga police. Reinhold says two weapons found at the scene belonged to servicemen.

ATHENS POLICE & FIRE DEPT. REPORTS FOR JUNE

The Athens City Council has received the reports on police and fire department activities for the month of June. Athens Police reported 45 thefts, 22 assaults, 15 burglaries, five sex offenses, three robberies, and two motor vehicle thefts in June. Police issued 346 citations for moving violations. There were 67 traffic accidents in June, with 14 injuries. Athens firefighters responded to 53 calls in June. Two were residential fires, 11 were vehicle accidents, one was a vehicle fire, and there were nine false alarms. Losses totaled \$22,000. \$18,000 of that was due to a residential fire on Summit Street.

- ✓ The Nuclear Regulatory Commission has scheduled a meeting for next Monday, July 27, in Athens to discuss the results of the operational readiness team inspection of the Unit 2 reactor at the Watts Bar Nuclear Plant. The inspection was concluded in June. In addition to discussing the results, the NRC staff will also cover the status of construction activities and the steps toward getting the reactor licensed and operating by the end of this year. The public meeting will be from 6 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. next Monday at the Comfort Inn, 2811 Decatur Pike, Athens.
- ✓ In conjunction with Humanities Tennessee and the Department of Veterans Affairs. E.G. Fisher Public Library announces its upcoming book discussion series called "Standing Down: From Warrior to Civilian." The book is a compilation of stories and essays spanning the history of Western civilization from the Iliad until the current conflicts in the Middle East. The discussion series begins on August 4 and will take place every other Tuesday until September 29 at 5:30 p.m. The discussion series is specifically for veterans of all wars, in an effort to assist veterans assimilate their experience and to make sense of their transition back to civilian life. The discussion leader will be Linda Moss Mines, the wife of a veteran and the chair of the Department of History and Social sciences at Girls Preparatory School of Chattanooga. The event is open to veterans of any war, but space is limited.
