◆ I-75 TRUCK DRIVER INDICTED

The driver of the tractor-trailer rig that crashed into seven vehicles and killed six people on Interstate 75 near the Ooltewah exit in June has been indicted on several charges. The Hamilton County Grand Jury indicted Benjamin Brewer, 39, on six counts of homicide, four counts of reckless aggravated assault, driving under the influence of narcotics, speeding, and making false reports about his duty status. Chattanooga police have issued an order for his arrest. Brewer, who is from London, Kentucky, was on duty for 50 consecutive hours in the three days leading up to the June 25 crash. Sources also say he tested positive for meth.

◆ RECOGNITION FOR ROGERS CREEK SCHOOL

Rogers Creek Elementary School in McMinn County is one of 11 schools in Southeast Tennessee that have been recognized for students' progress and performance. Governor Haslam and State Education Commissioner Candice McQueen announced the state's 170 Reward Schools for the past school year. Reward Schools are the top five percent of schools in the state for academic achievement and improvement in student test scores. Rogers Creek was honored for student progress.

TODAY IN HISTORY - AUG. 5

1861 - The U.S. government imposed its first income tax. All incomes over \$800 per year were taxed at the rate of 3%.

1914 - The first electric traffic lights in the U.S. were installed in Cleveland, Ohio. They were located at the corner of Euclid Avenue and 105th Street.

1930 - Astronaut Neil Armstrong was born. He received his pilot's license on his 16th birthday. On July 20, 1969, he became the first man to set foot on the moon.

1957 - A television show featuring a young and handsome DJ named Dick Clark debuted on ABC-TV. The after-school show featured such guest singers as Bobby Rydell, Frankie Avalon, Fabian, and Chubby Checker. It remained on TV until 1987. It was the network's longest-running show. August 5th is observed each year as American Bandstand Day.
