#### **♦** BIG NARCOTICS BUST IN ATHENS

McMinn County Sheriff Joe Guy announces the seizure of a "significant" amount of narcotics, money and guns. Officers stopped Jason Williams, 27, and discovered marijuana, illegal mushrooms, and drug paraphernalia. The investigation led them to a residence on Watts Road in Athens where they found jars full of marijuana

and over \$5,000 in cash. They also found packages of processed marijuana, Zanax pills, cocaine and two firearms. Sheriff Guy says officers found what appears to be a drug



known as Flakka, which is a very expensive and very dangerous synthetic narcotic. He says the street value of the narcotics is estimated at \$80,000. Jason Williams and LaMarcus Bishop face a variety of charges.

- Thursday was a day of losses on Wall Street as the Labor Department reported uninspiring unemployment numbers. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 120.72 to close at 17419.75. The Nasdaq was down 83.51 to close at 5056.44, and the S&P 500 dropped 16.28 to close at 2083.56.

#### **TODAY IN HISTORY - AUGUST 7**

- **1782 -** The Order of the Purple Heart was established by George Washington to honor Americans wounded in the Revolutionary War.
- **1925 -** Songwriter Felice Bryant was born. She and her husband, Boudleaux, wrote dozens of hit songs, including most of the Everly Brothers' hits and the song, "Rocky Top."
- **1928 -** Singer Herb Reed was born. He was a member of the Platters, who had such hits as "My Prayer" and "Smoke Gets In Your Eves."
- **1942 -** U.S. Marines launched America's first offensive in the Pacific in World War II, as they landed on the island of Guadalcanal.
- **1942 -** Singer B.J. Thomas was born. His hit records include "Raindrops Keep Falling," "Hooked On A Feeling," and "(Hey Won't You Play) Another Somebody Done Somebody Wrong Song."
- **1944 -** IBM dedicated the first program-controlled calculator, the Automatic Sequence Controlled Calculator which was known best as the Harvard Mark I. It was an early precursor to the modern computer age.
- 1955 Tokyo Telecommunications Engineering, the precursor to Sony, began selling its first transistor radios in Japan.
- 1973 Park ranger Roy Sullins was struck by lightning for the 5th time. As usual, he was not hurt.
- **1998 -** Islamic terrorist group al Qaida set off bombs at the U.S. embassies in Nairobi, Kenya, and Dar es Salaam, Tanzania, killing 224 people including 12 Americans and injuring more than 5,500.
- 2010 Elena Kagan was sworn in as the 112th justice and fourth woman to serve on the U.S. Supreme Court.
