◆ ANNIVERARY PASSES UNNOTICED

A tragic anniversary passed without notice on Thursday. It was in the early morning hours of August 20, 1975, that McMinn County

Deputy Dan Mull was having a cup of coffee at Crazy Ed's Truckstop when Kenneth Lee Clairborne walked in. Clairborne and three friends had iust committed an armed robbery in Knoxville. Claiborne had told his friends that he planned to shoot an officer that night. He walked up behind Deputy Mull and put a gun to the back of his head. He then took Mull's service revolver from his holster and shot him in the back of the head. Deputy



Mull was 56 and served under Sheriff Gary McAllister. He was the last McMinn County Sheriff's deputy to be killed in the line of duty. Clairborne and his associates were captured soon after the shooting.
